

THE HUDSON CITY ENCYCLOPEDIA

This encyclopedic index covers the people, places, and things mentioned in *Hudson City: The Urban Abyss*. It does not differentiate between player-oriented and GM-only material, so players using it may learn facts the GM does not wish them to know.

The designation “Map” refers to places marked on one or more maps in the book but not necessarily referred to in the text.
